News and Views



This week's parasha tells us that Hashem remembered Sarah, and gave her a child, Yitschak, the second of our forefathers. On this, the medrash quotes a verse from Bamidbar: "Man is unlike G-d to disappoint, or like man to be comforted, because man says things and doesn't do them". These words, uttered by Bilaam when he attempts to curse the Jewish people, talks about the fact that we need to have perfect faith in G-d – if He says he is going to do something, He will do it.

Yet this statement begs the question – what sort of G-d would He be if G-d didn't say that he would do what he promises to do? Obviously, G-d would keep his promise to Sarah and give her a child. Part of our belief in G-d is that he is completely perfect, that he won't forget things. Memory is a human thing – it's because we are humans that we are fallible. G-d however, does not have this failing.

It is clear that G-d remembering is far more than just a memory. It is a statement of relationship. This is the principle idea here – G-d didn't remember Sarah – he showed his personal care and love for her by giving her a child – he showed there was a personal relationship between them.

It is for this reason that we read this reading on first day Rosh Hashanah – G-d showed that he had a personal relationship with Sarah, by giving her a child. It is our fervent wish that G-d shows us that same personal relationship and love as he did to Sarah.

Let's take it one step further. The word used to remember is "Pakad", which means a deposit. If you had something valuable that you wanted someone else to keep, you wouldn't give it to an untrustworthy person. You give it to someone you trust.

G-d gives Sarah a Pikadon – a deposit of a son to Sarah, and shows her how much he believes in her, by entrusting her with a child. He trusted her to raise a child worthy to continue the lineage of Abraham, and this she does, bringing up an Isaac, who is so special, he is compared to a sacrifice which is completely holy to G-d.

It is no coincidence that we say in ADON OLAM: "into your hands, I **appoint** my spirit when I sleep and when I wake". The word for appoint is "Afkid", the future form of "Pakad". We entrust our soul in G-d's safe hands when we sleep. In exchange, the Master of the world entrusts us with His spirit which he infuses into every single one of us, he entrusts us to use that soul in the best possible way, by connecting to the



spiritual, and transforming that which is physical and giving it spiritual meaning. Let us ensure the sanctity of this relationship and prove true G-d's trust in us in this way. If we do, there is no doubt we will be remembered by G-d whenever we call out to Him.
